PUMPKIN PANDEMONIUM FOR ZOO ANIMALS

FRESNO, Ca. – Halloween at the Zoo is for the animals, too! On Saturday, October 25, some of the animals will feast on pumpkins during the Fresno Chaffee Zoo's Pumpkin Stomp 'n' Chomp. Throughout the day animal caretakers will give selected residents palate pleasing treats as part of the Zoo's enrichment program which is designed to stimulate natural behaviors in the animals such as foraging and play. Elephants, orangutans, tigers and birds will be among the animals that will get a chance to pound, pulverize and partake of pumpkins. Zoo visitors can pick up a schedule of feedings as they enter the Zoo on October 25.

The "gourd"geous treats, donated by Pumpkin King Pumpkin Patch located at the corner of Blackstone and Shaw, are part of the Zoo's ongoing enrichment program to help enrich the lives of the Zoo's animals, promote natural animal behavior, keep animals mentally stimulated and provide added enjoyment for visitors.

Fresno Chaffee Zoo is open every day of the year from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. General admission during regular Zoo hours is \$7 for adults, \$3.50 for children 2-11 and seniors 62+, and children under 2 and Fresno Chaffee Zoo members are free.
